Art. 1 GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. The XXXIII cycle of PhD programmes has been established, with administrative headquarters at the University of Brescia, for the following PhD programmes, in the academic year 2017/2018, lasting three years:

This admission notice is published while the authorization procedure is still in progress at the Ministry, as required by the MIUR (Ministry of Education, University and Research) Decree no. 45 of February 8, 2013. It is understood that the PhD Courses to be activated will be those for which the authorization procedure ends positively.

2. The courses last for three years, starting from 1 November 2017.

3. For each of the course included in this article, information relating to: activated curricula, positions available, research subjects, admission requirements, procedures and criteria of candidate selection and assessment for the drafting of a ranking list are found in **Annex A - PhD programme data sheets**, that form an integral part of this admission notice.

This admission notice is published on the University of Brescia Notice Board (

This admission notice is also published on the European website Euraxess and on that of the Ministry of Education, University and Research.

Any updates, amendments and additions to the admission notice and to the relative annexes will be communicated **exclusively** through publication on the online University Notice Board. **This publication is considered formal notification to all effects.**

4. By making an admission application via the online procedure outlined in Art. 5, the candidate accepts the regulations contained in this admission notice and the University of Brescia PhD Programme Regulations (issued on 12.02.2016. with Chancellor's Decree no. 5796).

Failure to comply with the regulations contained in this admission notice will lead to official exclusion from the competition process at any time it is detected.

Any personal communication with candidates will only be sent via email to the email address as provided by the candidate during the online enrolment procedure. The university assumes no responsibility for any failure in communication due to the candidate providing incorrect contact details or due to his /her failed or delayed notification of any changes in such details, nor due to postal or computer errors.

Art. 2 - ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. The admission procedure is open, with no citizenship limitation, to candidates who hold a specialist or Master's degree or a five-years' degree (Laurea Magistrale), pursuant to the Italian system preceding Ministerial Decree 509/1999, modified with Ministerial Decree 270/2004 or similar academic degree obtained abroad, comparable in duration and content with the Italian qualification and recognized in advance by the Admission Board, as provided for in Annex A - Ph.D. data sheets for the specific PhD Course for which the candidate intends to participate.

2. Candidates holding foreign university degrees that meet the requirements outlined in paragraph 1, can apply for reserved places.

3. Admission will be granted ***under the relevant conditions*** to candidates who apply within the deadline established by this admission notice and who will be awarded their Italian or foreign degrees, as per paragraph 1, **no later than 31/10/2017**. Within 3 days of being awarded their degrees, candidates must send self-declaration (or thie certificate, in the case of a degree awarded by a foreign institution) to the PhD and School of Specialisation Unit via email to: dottorati@unibs.it or via certified email (PEC) to: ammcentr@cert.unibs.it, specifying the name of the university that awarded the degree, the date it was awarded, the type of degree (pursuant to the Italian system preceding Ministerial Decree 509/1999, modified with Ministerial Decree 270/2004, specialist/Master's) and the relative mark/grade, together with a copy of a valid identity document. **Candidates who fail to provide notification of degree awards within the established deadlines or who provide notification that is incomplete, incorrect, sent by different means or to addresses different from those indicated above will be excluded from the application procedure.**

4. All candidates are admitted to the selection procedure subject to verification of self-certification, pursuant to Presidential Decree no. 445/2000 and subsequent additions and amendments. The University may, at any time during the procedure, even after the start of the PhD programmes, carry out checks on the truthfulness of the declarations provided. In the event of false declaration, the University may proceed, with a substantiated decision, with the exclusion of the candidate from the selection procedure or from the PhD programme, without prejudice to any resulting criminal liability.

Art. 3 DEGREE AWARDED ABROAD

1. The validity of foreign academic qualifications is verified by the Admission Board for the sole purpose of admission to the PhD programme, according to the relevant regulations in force in Italy and in compliance with international treaties or agreements on the recognition of academic qualifications for the pursuit of further studies.

2. By completing the online application, the applicant also makes the implicit request for the verification of the validity of his/her foreign academic qualification. For this purpose, the candidates must attach the following documents to the online application:

- **Dichiarazione di valore** (Declaration of Value of the academic qualification) "**in loco**" (in situ) issued by Italian diplomatic authorities in the country where the degree was awarded; This Declaration of Value of the academic qualification must state that the degree held is valid in the country in which it was awarded for enrolment in an equivalent PhD programme. The Declaration of Value of the academic qualification must specify the exams taken and relative grade/ mark; self-declaration is not allowed;

Alternatively, pending the issue of the Declaration of Value of the academic qualification in situ, a certificate of academic qualification achieved abroad complete of the list of the exams taken and relative grades/marks can be attached;

- **any other document deemed useful for** evaluating the validity of the academic qualification.

In the event that the documents described above are drafted in neither Italian nor English, they must be accompanied by a translation in Italian or in English.

If the academic qualification has already been declared equivalent to an Italian degree, the candidates must provide the name of the Italian University and the details of the decision by which this declaration was issued.

3. **Successful candidates who hold an academic qualification awarded abroad**, if they have not already done so when registering for admission must present to the PhD and School of Specialisation Unit, no later than 31 October 2017; the Declaration of Value of the academic qualification in situ issued by Italian diplomatic authorities in the country in which the degree was awarded. This Declaration of Value of the academic qualification must state that the degree held is valid in the country in which it was awarded for enrolment in an equivalent PhD programme, under penalty of losing the right of admission to the PhD programme (1/11/2017).

Only for those successful candidates who are waiting for the degree to be awarded, according to art. 2 paragraph 3 of this Admission Notice, the PhD and School of Specialisation Unit, shall provide, through specific communication, the terms within which the Declaration of Value of the academic qualification in situ should be submitted.

Successful candidates will be excluded from the PhD admission procedures if, following verification, it is found that the Declaration of Value of the academic qualification in situ filed under this paragraph do not comply with the requirements of this admission notice, and therefore cannot enrol in the PhD programme.

Art. 4 REQUIRED DOCUMENTS AND ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS

1. Candidates are obliged to present (as attachments to the online enrolment application outlined in the following article), the following documents (in pdf format) and academic qualifications that are **compulsory** for admission to all the PhD programmes included as part of this admission notice, written in Italian or English, or translated into Italian or English, **under penalty of exclusion from the competition:**

a) Identification document (identity card or passport with clearly indicated document number, issuing body, place and date of issue, photograph, personal details, expiry date) and passport-sized photograph;

b) Academic qualification:

- **For candidates who were awarded their degree in Italy:**

Declaration in lieu of academic qualification in situ (form downloadable from the relevant area of the online University Notice Board <http://en.unibs.it/university/university-notice-board-competitive-examinations-admission-notices-tenders/calls-and-notices-students-and-graduates/call->

competitive-examinations-research-doctorate-courses) attesting to possess the academic qualification, the awarding university, date it was awarded, final grade/ mark and list of exams taken with relative grades/marks achieved;

- **For candidates who were awarded their degree abroad:** the documents as describe in Art. 3 paragraph 2.
- **For candidates who have yet to be awarded their Italian or foreign degree:** Declaration in lieu (certified for candidates with qualification awarded abroad) of registration to sit the degree exam with a list of the exams taken and relative grades/marks achieved;

c) Curriculum vitae et studiorum;

d) Compulsory documents and qualifications as listed in Annex A – PhD data sheet for the specific PhD programme in which the candidate intends to participate;

Candidates may also produce the **optional documents and qualifications** listed in Annex A – PhD data sheet for the specific PhD programme in which the candidate intends to participate;

2. Simultaneous to the online enrolment application, the candidate may apply to be assessed for one of the **subject-specific grants, where applicable and included in Annex A - PhD data sheet** for the specific PhD programme, **by attaching an additional form signed in full (form downloadable from the relevant area of the online University Notice Board <http://en.unibs.it/university/university-notice-board-competitive-examinations-admission-notices-tenders/calls-and-notices-students-and-graduates/call-competitive-examinations-research-doctorate-courses>)**

The subject-specific grants will be allocated preferentially to successful full-time candidates, according to the order of merit of the ranking list.

3. Only those academic qualifications held by the candidate by the deadline of this admission notice will be subject to evaluation, without prejudice to that established in art. 2 paragraph 3.

Art. 5 - ADMISSION APPLICATION

1. Admission applications can be made from 07 July 2017 at 14:00 hours (Italian time) and no later than 13:00 hours (Italian time) on 25 August 2017.

No enrolment fees are requested

2. The admission application must be completed via the dedicated online procedure, under penalty of exclusion from the competition, and involves two stages:

REGISTRATION ON THE UNIVERSITY WEBSITE: in order to make an online admission application, the candidate must register his/her personal details on the university portal: **<https://esse3.unibs.it>**, and click on " Online Candidate Registration".

Those who have already enrolled in previous years at the University of Brescia and have graduated, withdrawn from studies, lost student status or moved to another university (in any case, those who are recognised by the computer system) will be recognised by the system and, in the event that registration details have been lost or forgotten, must go to "Recover password" (recupero credenziali).

Once registration is complete, user credentials will be provided (username and password - to be saved on file or printed for future logins);

LOGIN AND ENROLMENT: proceed with the login (enter username and password). Go to **SEGRETERIA>TEST DI AMMISSIONE> ISCRIZIONE CONCORSI** and follow the guided procedure, which includes uploading a compulsory **ID photo. (supported image formats are: bitmap (*.bmp) or jpeg (*.jpg) maximum size 3x4 cm 500 dpi (equivalent to 576x768 pixels).**

Once the procedure is complete, the candidate must print off the receipt in PDF, to be kept as proof of enrolment which must be presented at the oral examination, if admitted to the competition.

3. Documents, qualifications and publications as outlined in Art. 4 must be presented in PDF format and attached to the online application (except what is provided for in the following paragraph 6). **Each file and/or folder in ZIP or RAR format must not exceed a size of 10 MB.** The candidate

may add, edit or remove attached documents, even after completing the online application described in paragraph 2 above, as long as it is undertaken within the admission notice deadline set out in paragraph 1.

4. The name of the attached files must include the surname of the candidate and the name of the programme (e.g. surname_filename_programme name).

5. In the case of PhDs divided into different curricula, where deemed compulsory - in Annex A - PhD data sheet of each PhD - , the candidate must choose one or more by selecting a priority list.

6. The candidate may submit the documents identified in Art. 4. paragraph 1, letter d) and other useful documents, accompanied by a list of contents, definitely not later than the expiry of the admission notice referred to in paragraph 1 above, using one or more of the following methods (preferred method **a.** where technically possible):

a - upload in the reserved area of the website “ISCRIZIONE CONCORSI” as outlined in paragraph 3 (file and/or folders in ZIP o RAR format, not exceeding a size of 10 MB);

b - hard copy or digital support device (CD, DVD or USB pen drive) sent via post or private courier to the following address: University of Brescia, U.O.C. Protocollo, Piazza del Mercato, 15 - 25121 Brescia. The envelope must show the name and surname of the candidate and the wording: “Competitive examination for admission to the PhD programme in [*PhD programme title.....*]”;

c - send a hard copy or digital support device (CD, DVD or USB pen drive) delivered by hand, in an envelope, to the following address: University of Brescia, U.O.C. Protocollo, Piazza del Mercato, 15 - 25121 Brescia (public opening hours of the Registration Unit Office: Monday to Friday from 9 am to 3 pm, Italian time). The envelope must display the name and surname of the candidate and the words: “Competitive examination for the PhD in [*PhD programme title.....*]”;

The documents must be delivered by the date and time set as the application deadline. The postal stamp is not considered proof of delivery. All publications and other documents presented in original hard copy format and/or relative digital support devices, being an integral part of the admission application, are not returnable, even upon request.

7. Applications that are found to be incomplete, non-compliant or are not submitted according to the methods and within the deadlines of this article are considered invalid.

8. Candidates who intend to participate in the competition for more than one PhD course must make separate online applications for each course, attaching the required documents for each application (Art.4).

9. Candidates with a certified disability or with a certified diagnosed specific learning disorder (SLD) can notify the university of the need for assistance by attaching the relevant documents to the online application.

10. The University administration assumes no responsibility in the case of documents presented in digital format being illegible due to damaged files and/or folders.

11. Candidates are advised to make their applications well ahead of the application deadline; the university assumes no responsibility for any malfunction due to technical problems and/or overload of communication networks and/or application systems, and possible postal mistakes.

Art. 6 - ADMISSION TESTS

1. The admission test includes the evaluation of academic qualifications and relative examinations (written and/or presentation of a research project and/or oral test), according to the procedures and dates as provided in Annex A - PhD data sheets, included as part of this admission notice.

The dates of the tests as envisaged in Annex A - PhD data sheets are considered, for all legal effects, formal summoning.

The dates of the competition tests not provided in the attached Annex A - PhD data sheets will be published on the online University Notice Board of the University of Brescia website: <http://en.unibs.it/university/university-notice-board-competitive-examinations-admission-notices-tenders/calls-and-notices-students-and-graduates/call-competitive-examinations-research-doctorate-courses>

at least 20 days in advance. Any modifications or additions to the test schedule will be published exclusively on the same web page.

These publications are considered formal notification to all effects; therefore, candidates are obliged to present themselves, with no further prior warning, at the indicated location, on the stated day and at the stated time, with a valid ID document.

The absence of a candidate will be understood as his/her withdrawal from the procedure, for whatever reason.

2. Oral exams, only if stated in Annex A - PhD data sheets for the chosen PhD course, may be undertaken in a language other than Italian.

Candidates resident abroad and those for whom particular justifications are foreseen, if and when provided for in Annex A - PhD data sheets, may sit the oral exam remotely, on the dates / time provided, by using an audio and video teleconference device (e.g. Skype). In this case, candidates **MUST** attach the completed "online oral exam" form, which can be downloaded from the website <http://en.unibs.it/university/university-notice-board-competitive-examinations-admission-notices-tenders/calls-and-notices-students-and-graduates/call-competitive-examinations-research-doctorate-courses>, to the enrolment application, under penalty of exclusion from admission to the competitive exams. The candidate must indicate his/her contact details (Skype address, etc.) in the admission application and guarantee the use of a webcam to enable his/her identification by the Admission Board.

The Admission Board makes certain that the conditions necessary to guarantee the correct undertaking of the exam are met (verification of candidate identity and the correct online communication for interview purposes). The university assumes no responsibility in the event of technical problems that fail to guarantee the correct undertaking of the oral exam.

Art. 7 - PROGRAMME ADMISSION BOARDS

1. The Admission Boards are appointed by the respected PhD Course Coordinator upon recommendation by the respective PhD Course Board of Professors and are made up of at least three permanent lecturers and/or researchers of the University.

2. The Admission Boards establish the evaluation criteria and the scores assigned to academic qualifications before the tests are taken, where applicable, taking into consideration that specified **in Annex A - PhD data sheets.**

3. The Admission Boards assign grades/marks and, upon completion of the exams procedures send the results to the relevant Students' Service to be published on the University's online notice board.

Art. 8 - RANKING LISTS

1. According to art. 7 of the PhD Rules and Regulations the final ranking list for each PhD Course is set by the Admission Board by calculating the sum, for eligible candidates only, of the scores obtained in the qualification evaluation and those obtained in the tests. Only if differentiated tests are provided separate rankings will be formed.

Candidates eligible for positions reserved for foreign university graduates are conveniently highlighted in the ranking. For candidates admitted under the terms of Article 2, paragraph 3 of this notice, the evaluation of the acceptance qualification is replaced by the evaluation of the average of the credits received during the PhD Programme. Based on the number of positions available, candidates who achieve the required positions on the final ranking list for each programme, are

admitted to the PhD programme. **The ranking lists will be published on the online University Notice Board** on the website:

At the same time as the publication of the ranking lists, notification will be given of the **definitive** deadlines for enrolment applications and the methods of registration, as best shown in Art. 9.

This publication is considered to be a formal communication, therefore interested parties will not receive written communication of the above.

2. In the event of withdrawal by eligible candidates before the beginning of the programmes, they will be replaced in the same number by candidates from the ranking list, in order of merit.

Individual candidates admitted through scrolling down the ranking list are only advised by e-mail at the address provided during registration for the competition. The deadline for enrolment is also provided by in the same communication.

3. In the case of equal ranking scores, for a place with a grant, precedence will be given based on the assessment of the economic status of the household, determined pursuant to the legislation in force on the Right to Education.

In the case of equal merit for a place without a grant, precedence is given to the youngest candidate.

In the case that the candidate is successful in multiple ranking lists, he/she must choose only one PhD Course. The choice of PhD Course made at the time of registration **is final** and it shall not be possible to change it under any circumstances.

Art. 9 - COURSE REGISTRATION

1. **Registration must be completed, under penalty of loss of student status, using the procedures and by the deadlines established with the publication of the ranking list or, in case of scrolling down, within the term specifically indicated to the candidate as per art. 8, paragraphs 1 and 2.**

Successful candidates who fail to meet the indicated deadline shall be understood to have withdrawn and places left vacant shall be made available to eligible candidates according to the order of the final merit ranking list.

2. **Successful competitors must present** through certified e-mail (PEC) to the address: ammcentr@cert.unibs.it **or** by registered mail with return receipt (to the address: University of Brescia - U.O.C. Protocollo, Piazza del Mercato, 15 - 25121 Brescia. The envelope must display the following: "Registration application for the PhD in ") or by hand (to U.O.C. Protocollo, Piazza del Mercato, 15 - 25121 Brescia, Faustino 74/B - Brescia, public opening hours: from Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m to 3:00 p.m. Italian Time), the **documentation** listed below:

a) PhD registration application (form downloadable from the website <http://en.unibs.it/university/university-notice-board-competitive-examinations-admission-notices-tenders/calls-and-notices-students-and-graduates/call-competitive-examinations-research-doctorate-courses> PhD), including the following declarations in lieu:

- Having a specialist/Master's degree or degree (Laurea Magistrale), pursuant to the Italian system preceding Ministerial Decree 509/1999, modified with Ministerial Decree 270/2004;
- **declaration that he/she has not already benefited, even in part, from another student grant for a PhD Course;**
- **that he/she is not enrolled and that he/she does not intend to enrol on another old system degree programme, specialist/Master's degree programme, PhD Course for the full duration of the abovementioned Course, both in Italy and abroad;**
- **that he/she is not enrolled and does not intend to enrol at a School of Specialisation in a non-medical field. If enrolled, he/she undertakes to suspend attendance before the beginning of the**

Course, where possible; if enrolled in the final year, he/she undertakes to conclude the specialist education before the beginning date of the PhD Courses;

b) full photocopy (front/back) of a valid identity document;

c) payment receipt for the Lombardy Region's Right to Study contribution as per the following Art. 10;

d) Just for those awarded student grants, it will also be necessary to present a declaration in lieu of affidavit, on unstamped paper, made in accordance with Art.38 of Presidential Decree 445/2000, including the following:

- the undertaking not to combine the grant with any other student grant awarded, with the exception of those awarded by national or foreign institutions for use in PhD research carried out abroad;

- current account number, with IBAN, for issuing student grant payments;

- copy of independent registration with the Italian social security and welfare institute, if already in possession at the time of enrolment. If not in possession, the student must provide it by the first month following the beginning of the programme.

e) Candidates who hold DEGREES AWARDED ABROAD, must also submit the documents detailed in Art. 3, paragraph 3.

3. The enrolment application with documents indicated in paragraph 2 attached, **must arrive, under penalty of losing student status, no later than the established enrolment deadline. For applications sent by post, the postal stamp will not be considered proof of delivery.**

Applications sent via non-certified email are not accepted.

Just for successful candidates resident abroad without PEC (certified e-mail) the documentation can be sent by ordinary e-mail to: dottorati@unibs.it, by the set date for registration. Upon their arrival in Italy they will deposit the same original documentation with the Dottorati e Scuole di Specializzazione (PhD and Schools of Specialisation Unit), via San Faustino no. 74/b, Brescia.

4. If, following verification, the documents are found to contain false or misleading declarations, without prejudice to the sanctions envisaged by the Italian Penal Code and by the specific legislation (Articles 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree 445/2000), the candidate will be excluded.

The University Administration will proceed with the recovery of any benefits awarded (such as student grants, reduced university fees) and will not refund any fees already paid.

Art. 10 - CONTRIBUTIONS FOR ADMISSION AND ATTENDANCE

1. For the A.Y. 2017/2018, the following contributions are set for students enrolled on PhD programmes, whether they benefit from a grant or do not benefit from a grant:

- Stamp duty € 16.00

- Regional contribution for the Right to Education (Lombardy Region) € 140.00;

Total € 156.00 MAV (payment slip).

Art. 11 STUDENT GRANTS

1. The student grants envisaged in the admission notice are allocated according to the merit ranking list drawn up by the Admission Board.

2. Student grants, currently set at € 13,638.47 per year, before deducting PhD student expenses, are issued at the end of each month.

The total grant may be increased by 50% for periods of research abroad for a continuous period of at least 15 days, if approved by the PhD Board of Professors, for a total duration of no more than 18 months over three years. This increase applies to each PhD student (whether benefiting from a grant or not).

3. PhD grants may not be combined with other student grants of any kind, except for those awarded by national or foreign institutions for use as part of PhD research activity undertaken abroad.

Students who have already benefited, even in part, from another student grant for a PhD programme cannot be awarded a grant.

PhD grants have a year-long duration and are renewed on the condition that the PhD student has completed the programme of activities envisaged for the previous year, subject to verification by the Teaching Board.

4. As of the second year, each PhD student (whether beneficiary of a grant or without the benefit of a grant) is ensured a budget for research activity in Italy and abroad for a sum of no less than 10% of the total annual grant (Art. 10 current PhD Student Regulations).

5. Students who receive grants awarded for a specific research subject are bound to undertake that subject of research only.

Art. 12 - INCOMPATIBILITY

1. Registration with PhD Courses is incompatible with the simultaneous registration with Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes, subject to what is provided for in Art. 5 of the PhD Student Regulations, Master's Degree Programmes or other PhD Programmes in Italy or abroad, with the exception of international PhD Programmes and those with joint dissertation supervision.

Art. 13 PhD STUDENT OBLIGATIONS

1. PhD students must comply with the obligations set out in the current University of Brescia PhD Student Rules and Regulations.

2. PhD students shall follow the activities foreseen as part of the formative study programme and shall dedicate themselves exclusively and full-time to their individual and guided study programmes and to undertaking their assigned research activities.

Art. 14 - AWARDING OF QUALIFICATION

1. Subject to successfully passing the final exam, the PhD qualification is awarded to PhD students who, at the end of the PhD Course, have achieved results of significant scientific value, documented by a final written thesis.

Art. 15 - PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

1. The University Administration, pursuant to Legislative Decree 196/2003 ("Personal Data Protection Code") undertakes to use the personal data provided by the candidate solely for selection procedures and institutional purposes.

2 Participation in the competitive admission procedure, in compliance with the principles of the abovementioned law, implies the candidate's tacit consent to the publication of his/her name and competitive exam details on the university website.
