

Jessica Galli, MD, PhD, (born in Orzinuovi, Italy) graduated in Clinical and Surgical Medicine at the University of Brescia in 2005.

She became a specialist in child Neuropsychiatry in 2011. Since April 2011 she is working in the Child Neurology and Psychiatry Unit, ASST Spedali Civili of Brescia and at the University of Brescia as Research Fellow. She lectures in the Speciality of Child Neuropsychiatry as well in the school for physiotherapy, health care, obstetrics and psychiatric rehabilitation.

She achieved PhD in Neuroscience in 2015, following a project titled “Neurovisual profile in cerebral palsy: from visual disorders to visuocognitive dysfunctions” .

Dr Galli’s main research interests are:

- Clinical, neuropsychological and rehabilitative aspects of cerebral palsy
- Visual disorders in children affected by cerebral visual impairment or visual peripheral problems
- Rare diseases (Aicardi-Goutieres Syndrome, congenital cerebellar malformations)
- Epilepsy in children (clinical and diagnostic features, quality of life in epileptic patients)
- Neuropsychological aspects of children born to mothers affected by immune diseases

As part of her professional experience, Dr Galli published papers and book’s chapters on Cerebral Palsy, Visual Disorders, Epilepsy and Aicardi-Goutieres Syndrome.

She is a member of following Scientific Societies: Italian Society of Child and Adolescence Neuropsychiatry (SINPIA); Italian League Against Epilepsy (LICE).
